Getting Healthcare Right FY2023 Off to a Strong Start

Just over two months into Fiscal Year 2023 (FY2023), and we are already off to a fast and encouraging start to the new year. Further building on the momentum of our strong finish to Fiscal Year 2022, we are seeing solid early performance across many of our pillars, with the following highlights:

Safety/Quality/Population Health: With a new more sensitive measurement
methodology, we are slightly below our goal for *Falls with Harm*, but are meeting
the goal for *Hospital Acquired Infections (HAIs)*, and both safety measures are
trending in the right direction — meaning we are reducing harm events.



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- Service: While it's too early for final results from July and August, early feedback from our patients
 indicates we are performing better than goal in both HCAHPS and EDCAHPS, and just slightly below
 goal for CGCAHPS.
- **Culture/People:** Our **New Hire Turnover rate** continues to improve each month, and in July, decreased to **31.33%** well below the regional average of nearly 40%.
- Growth: Net Operating Revenue is above goal at 102.9%, while TPP's RVUs (patients encounters) are roughly at target of 99.6% due primarily to physician vacations and a later start for some of our new primary care physicians. However, we expect to be meeting goal by October. And, year-over-year primary care RVUs are slightly ahead, compared with this time last year.
- **Finance:** Operating Margin is *performing extremely well at 117.6%*, ahead of our goal, which is particularly encouraging given challenges with inflation and industry-wide workforce shortages.

These early results are positive signs that we continue to move toward a more stable, post-pandemic state – allowing us to redouble our efforts to accelerate our work to Get Healthcare Right! Keep up the great work!!

COVID Update

New COVID cases at TriHealth and in the community remain stable. We currently have 37 COVID inpatients and no COVID patients on ventilators in TriHealth hospitals, with a 21.2% average positivity rate over the past two weeks. As a reminder, we are now offering the bivalent COVID boosters to the community at our Good Samaritan Western Ridge COVID Vaccine Clinic (Mondays 9am-6pm) and the former Bethesda North Outpatient Imaging (BNOI) COVID Vaccine Clinic (Thursdays 8am-6pm). We plan to have the COVID bivalent vaccine available to team members during many team member flu clinics this fall, and we'll share more details soon.

COVID-19 Weekly Update

- 37 COVID-positive patients in TriHealth hospitals with 0 on a ventilator in ICU.
- 13.1% COVID positivity rate in the region, with 21.2% positivity rate for symptomatic patients tested at TriHealth over past two weeks. Target positvity rate is under 5%!
- Community Levels: 1 county at "Low": Clinton. 9 counties at "Medium" – Boone, Campbell, Dearborn, Franklin, Hamilton, Highland, Kenton, Ripley, Warren. 4 counties at "High" - Adams, Brown, Butler, Clermont

Thank you, as always, for everything you continue to do to help us **Get Healthcare Right** for our community! We're off to a great start in FY2023, and I have no doubt this renewed post-pandemic momentum will only continue in the months ahead!
