Team Member Town Hall, Today at Noon



COVID Update

The encouraging trend of lower, more stable COVID case rates continues throughout the county and here at TriHealth, where we currently have just 19 COVID inpatients and one on a ventilator (see weekly COVID graphics to right for details). To provide some perspective on just how far we've come, last year at this time, we had **74 COVID inpatients**, with **13 on**
