Our own **Jeremiah Kirkland**, President of Bethesda Butler Hospital and McCullough-Hyde Memorial Hospital, represented TriHealth as a featured presenter at the event. Jeremiah discussed the strategies and initiatives being taken by TriHealth to address social determinants of health – like socio-economic status, food insecurity, lack of transportation, and others – which affect both access to healthcare and overall health and even life expectancy.
