Preparing the Next Generation of Healthcare Professionals: 16 CPS Students Graduate from TriHealth's School to Work Program

Last Thursday, May 2, I had the privilege of joining TriHealth team members, leaders and physicians in celebrating the 16 Cincinnati Public School (CPS) high school seniors who graduated from our innovative School to Work (STW) program. Among this year's graduating class, 13 students are college bound, two have plans to enlist in military service to pursue careers in nursing, and one is immediately pursuing a career in healthcare. And all of the graduates have credited their STW program experience as the reason for their career choices!



A collaboration between TriHealth and CPS, the program gives CPS high school juniors and seniors the opportunity to gain real-life healthcare experience by rotating through and working in various departments and clinical settings at Good Samaritan Hospital. Since launching in 2019, nearly 110 students have participated in the STW program and CPS student interest in the program has skyrocketed with 90 applicants for 30 positions just this year! And this is resulting in more and more high school students choosing careers in healthcare, and that's a really good thing!!!
